

Vermont Green FC Release 2025 Pre-Match Top with Zero Gravity

Vermont Green Football Club has launched the 2025 Pre-Match Top ahead of the USL League Two season. The shirt is made from 100% recycled material and designed by club co-founder Matthew Wolff.

The 2025 Pre-Match Top features the iconic Zero Gravity hummingbird logo on the chest, and the Green Mountain Solar and 1% for the Planet logos on the left sleeve and right hip. Vermont Green FC is proud to feature the logos of three Vermont-based partners who are committed to sustainability, climate action, and the growth of soccer in Vermont.

Each kit is made from approximately 23 recycled plastic water bottles and is Global Recycling Standard certified. Vermont Green FC is playing a small part in helping PlayerLayer, official kit partner, convert more than 12 million recycled plastic water bottles into new products each year.

The two factories that produce the club's kits are covered in 992 solar panels that will generate power savings equivalent to over 340 tons of carbon dioxide. This is equivalent to taking nearly 74 passenger vehicles off the road each year.

Vermont Green FC vs. FC Laval

Saturday, May 24, 2025 2:00pm Kickoff

Vermont Green FC will welcome FC Laval to Virtue Field on Saturday for the 2025 edition of the Maple Cup. The annual cup, in just its second year, pits top opponents from Quebec against the Green in a cross-border celebration of soccer and the beloved maple industry that the two communities share.

We look forward to warmly welcoming our neighbors from Quebec, now more than ever, to make a collective statement on the strength of friendship and solidarity.

FC LAVAL IN FOCUS

The Ligue 1 Quebec Champions will make their way to Virtue Field on Saturday, bringing with them a vibrant history in the Canadian lower-leagues and a recent run of successes.

Laval won Ligue 1 Quebec in 2024 and qualified for the 2025 Canadian Championship (which is similar to the U.S. Open Cup). They faced professional side York United FC in the first round, and despite losing 5-0, the Quebecers showed their merit against one of their nation's top clubs.

FC Laval was formed in 1971 after a merger of clubs and took on the name CS Fabrose in 1974. In 2021, CS Fabrose merged with two more clubs (CS Chomedey and Delta Laval) to form FC Laval. The club's sporting director is Amro Radwan.

In 2024, FC Laval's women's team played Vermont Green FC in the Green's inaugural Women's Exhibition Match, falling in penalties after a thrilling 90 minutes.

Fans of the Green should anticipate a high level of play from the Canadians, and they'll come to Virtue Field looking to get their hands on the coveted Maple Cup.





A FOURTH GENERATION FAMILY FARM

Our 560-acre farm is located in Chittenden, Vermont and has been in the Baird family for four generations. Bonnie and Bob Baird own and operate the farm today while their daughter Jenna and her partner Jacob run the maple syrup business. Bob's grandparents, Sara and Ralph Baird, both grew up on farms on the road.

In 1918 they purchased our farm from Sara's sister and brother-in-law. Their son Richard took over the operation in the 1940s and ran the farm until 1979 when Bonnie and Robert purchased the property. Maple syrup was produced here even before the Bairds moved to the property.

When Sara and Ralph began farming they milked cows and made butter that was sold door-todoor in the nearby town of Rutland. As the dairy herd grew, milk was sold into the Boston market and later to our local Cabot cheese plant. The milking cows were sold in 1996 and, since that time,



maple syrup has been the primary crop on the farm. Jenna and Jacob have greatly expanded the maple retail market and agritourism on the farm. Stop by and visit or schedule a tour to learn more about the operation!

KING STREET CENTER

Vermont Green FC is partnering with King Street Center to make matches more accessible and inviting to historically marginalized communities. The program is focused on building community ties between VGFC players and King Street Center youth and families. Players will join King Street Center youth regularly to engage in soccer activities and discuss their path toward playing soccer at the highest levels. Vermont Green will donate free tickets through its "Spread the Love" initiative so they can attend home games throughout the season.

JUBA STAR FC

Vermont Green is partnered with Juba Star Football Club to expand access to soccer and work towards equitable play in the state. Juba Star FC is a Somali Bantu-led organization that has operated in the state since 2006. The organization was established to provide a safe space for the growth and development of former refugee and immigrant youth in Vermont. The organization runs free soccer clubs for youth and adults, ages 14 and older, and provides assistance with transportation to games and practices, and mentorship for youth.

What sets Vermont Green FC apart is its deep commitment to environmental justice. The club's mission is to build a soccer organization that addresses the climate crisis and promotes sustainability at every level—from using kits made with 100% recycled materials to donating 1% of its annual revenue to environmental causes as part of One Percent for the Planet. Vermont Green FC believes soccer can be a powerful force for social and ecological change.

Off the pitch, the club is equally committed to community. Through soccer programming, volunteer coaching, and regular community engagement, Vermont Green FC helps create opportunities for local youth communities to connect through sport. The club is more than just a team—it's a platform for impact.

Vermont Green FC continues to grow both in stature and influence, inspiring fans with a model of how soccer can be played with purpose and integrity. As they compete and engage, the team remains focused on uniting sport, sustainability, and justice to create lasting change.



ENVIORNMENTAL JUSTICE MISSION

ABOUT USL2

USL League Two is the leader in pre-professional soccer in North America. The League holds a vital role as it continues to provide the elite platform for those pursuing professional careers domestically and internationally.

The USL League Two regular season takes place during the summer from early May to mid-July. Each team plays at least 12 regular season games within their division, splitting the number of home and away matches. Each division winner qualifies for the playoffs, as well as the second-place team of select divisions. The playoffs are split into conferences and occur in late July, culminating in the League Two Final in early August.
