# CLUB NEWS

## VGFC BOLSTERS ROSTER WITH JUNE SIGNINGS

Vermont Green FC has announced the addition of five players to the squad for the remainder of the 2025 USL League Two season. The club has also welcomed a new goalkeeper coach.

The following players arrived in the month of June:

**Ryan Zellefrow**, 18-year old tenacious midfielder and national champion with the University of Vermont. Originally from Berywn, PA, Zellefrow will wear the #27 shirt after completing a transfer from West Chester United.

19-year old left back #44 **Gabe Fernandez**, a transfer from FC Olympia and rising sophomore at the University of Washington.

19-year old winger #24 **Alex Hall**, also a transfer from FC Olympia and rising sophomore at University of Washington.

Midfielder #7 **Brandon Parrish**, two-time national champion with Clemson and 36th pick in the 2024 MLS SuperDraft, arrives from Lexington SC. Parrish, known for his box-to-box quality, is comfortable operating anywhere in the midfield.

Right back **Nathan Simeon**—who played for the Green in 2024 and won the National Championship with the University of Vermont—has rejoined the club from Reading United AC. He will wear the #23 shirt.

With the departure of Ben Wölfinger in mid-June, Vermont Green has announced the addition of **Rob Emmett** as goalkeeper coach. Emmet is the current head coach of Norwich University men's soccer, and previously worked with Middlebury College men's soccer.



# TODAY'S MATCHUP

## Vermont Green FC vs. New England FC

*Saturday, June 27, 2025*

*6:00pm Kickoff*

Vermont Green FC will face league newcomers and playoff contenders New England Futbol Club on Saturday night at Virtue Field in a crucial Northeast Division matchup. The Vermonters are unbeaten through nine matches and tied atop the division table with a game in hand, but the third place NEFC are chomping at the bit to pace the league leaders. They'll be heading north with a roster loaded with former MLS academy talent.

### **HISTORY**

This match will be the first encounter between Vermont Green FC and New England FC, as the Worcester, MA-based visitors are in their debut season in USL League Two. This will be the only regular season meeting between the two sides this season.

### **NEFC IN FOCUS**

New England Futbol Club was founded in 2009 and is based in Greater Boston and Worcester, Massachusetts. The club has a nationally-recognized pedigree of youth talent, and serves as a launching pad for high level youth soccer players in New England. The club has operations throughout Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and New Hampshire.

The club is currently in their inaugural USL League Two season, and is 6W-3L-1T through their first 10 games, pacing Western Mass Pioneers and Vermont Green with 19 points to the league leaders' 23, and are firmly in third place. They have brought a high level of play to a division that was already considered among the best in the country, and have managed big wins against top clubs like Seacoast United Phantoms.

The Massachusetts side boasts a roster full of former NEFC Academy and New England Revolution Academy players that now play at top NCAA Division 1 programs, many of whom have played together for years. This combination of youth, talent, and familiarity has proven a successful combination for head coach Jake Beverlin, who, alongside Director Paul Baber—formerly of Seacoast United—have set the new club up for success.

Vermont Green FC fans should expect a high energy encounter on Saturday, and should brace themselves for NEFC to be Northeast Division contenders this year and into the future.





## KING STREET CENTER

Vermont Green FC is partnering with King Street Center to make matches more accessible and inviting to historically marginalized communities. The program is focused on building community ties between VGFC players and King Street Center youth and families. Players will join King Street Center youth regularly to engage in soccer activities and discuss their path toward playing soccer at the highest levels. Vermont Green will donate free tickets through its "Spread the Love" initiative so they can attend home games throughout the season.

## JUBA STAR FC

Vermont Green is partnered with Juba Star Football Club to expand access to soccer and work towards equitable play in the state. Juba Star FC is a Somali Bantu-led organization that has operated in the state since 2006. The organization was established to provide a safe space for the growth and development of former refugee and immigrant youth in Vermont. The organization runs free soccer clubs for youth and adults, ages 14 and older, and provides assistance with transportation to games and practices, and mentorship for youth.

# ABOUT USL2

USL League Two is the leader in pre-professional soccer in North America. The League holds a vital role as it continues to provide the elite platform for those pursuing professional careers domestically and internationally.

The USL League Two regular season takes place during the summer from early May to mid-July. Each team plays at least 12 regular season games within their division, splitting the number of home and away matches. Each division winner qualifies for the playoffs, as well as the second-place team of select divisions. The playoffs are split into conferences and occur in late July, culminating in the League Two Final in early August.

## WHY USL2?

Vermont Green FC competes in USL League Two, the proven developmental leader in North American soccer's evolving tiered structure.

USL League Two (formerly the PDL) features clubs throughout the United States and Canada.

USL League Two is an important stepping-stone for top professionals now playing throughout the world, with more than 70 percent of all selections in the MLS SuperDraft since 2010 having League Two experience.

By joining USL League Two, Vermont Green FC fills a gap in the Vermont soccer system, giving the state's top players the opportunity to train and compete at the highest level while maintaining their collegiate eligibility.

## NORTHEAST DIVISION

The USL League Two Northeast Division is a dynamic and competitive region that showcases the depth of soccer talent across New England and upstate New York. With clubs based in Connecticut, Massachusetts, Vermont, New Hampshire, and New York, the division blends long-standing organizations with ambitious newcomers.

Competing teams, AC Connecticut, Albany Rush, Black Rock FC, Boston Bolts, Boston City FC, New England Futbol Club, Seacoast United Phantoms, Vermont Green FC, and Western Mass Pioneers, bring a range of histories, playing styles, and community-driven missions to the field.
