



# THE MIRACLE AT LUSITANO

The Boys in Green completed an undefeated regular season with a dramatic 2-2 draw, scoring goals in the 95th and 99th minute to snatch victory from the jaws of defeat.

The evening's foes—the mighty Western Mass Pioneers—were just seconds away from being crowned Northeast Division Champions for a third time, before O'Malley's wonderstrike altered the course of history, and secured Vermont Green's first division title.

A brief thunderstorm delayed kickoff by 30 minutes, before the clouds parted and a beautiful rainbow emerged above the 107-year old stadium.

It was a battle from the first whistle. The Pioneers came out with a level of intensity the Green had not yet faced this season, and the early moments the match saw heavy challenges and yellow cards.

Western Mass looked the better side, dominating possession and creating chances on goal. The Green were on the back foot.

In the 41st minute, Western Mass got their goal. Gustavo Barbosa curled a perfect free kick towards Juan Hermoso, whose powerful header rippled the back of the net.

The half ended 1-0 with the Pioneers ahead, the trophy squarely in their sights.

After the break, the Pioneers came out swinging again. Knowing they needed a win to secure the title, the hosts did not relent, sending waves of attack into Green territory. In the 64th minute, Israel Neto latched onto a Barbosa pass and finished past Herceg to double the lead. The stadium was electrified, and the Pioneers' were firmly in control.

But the Boys in Green never gave up hope.

Labovitz, Ibrahim, Parrish, Zellefrow, McCann, and O'Malley all entered the fray in the second half, as

desperation mounted for Vermont. The clock hit 90' with the Green trailing 2-0, and the Pioneers' just moments away from the title. The referee indicated 10 minutes of stoppage time. It was now or never for the Green...and they needed two.

The clock showed 90+5' when Labovitz clipped a cross towards Zengue, who controlled it with his chest before pounding it into the top right corner. A glimmer of hope.

In the 90+9th minute, Alex Hall sailed a 40 yard ball diagonally into the path of Owen O'Malley. O'Malley saw his moment and did not hesitate. Brimming with confidence, he took two touches before unleashing a rocket from outside the area.

Top right corner. The sound of the net. The explosion of joy from the traveling fans.

The Green completed the comeback returning hero, the MLS draft pick, a boy who started in the first ever Vermont Green match over three years ago.

A fairytale finish to the regular season from a man who bleeds Green.



# OUR MATCHUP

## Vermont Green FC vs. Hudson Valley Hammers

Saturday, July 18, 2025

7:00pm Kickoff

The Round of 32 is set.

Vermont Green FC will host Hudson Valley Hammers on Friday, July 18th at 7pm to begin the USL League Two Playoffs presented by VensureHR. The Green earned a spot in the Round of 32 by winning the Northeast Division. The Hammers will come to Burlington fresh off a big First Round playoff win over Ocean City Nor'Easters.

### HISTORY

Vermont Green FC and Hudson Valley Hammers will play for the first time ever on Friday, but the two clubs have orbited one another while vying for playoff spots in the past.

In 2022, the Green defeated the Western Mass Pioneers at Virtue Field on the final day of the regular season, finishing third in the Northeast Division, and earning the Eastern Conference wildcard berth. The win meant the Green edged out the Hammers for the final wildcard spot.

In 2024, the Green and the Hammers were again watching each other's results in the final match of the season. The Green claimed the final playoff spot that again left the Hammers out in the cold. No, there isn't on-field history between the two sides, but there could be slightly more resentment from the Hudson Valley than the Green realize.

### HUDSON VALLEY HAMMERS IN FOCUS

Hudson Valley Hammers were founded in 2020 with a group led by United States Men's National Team captain Tyler Adams, a Hudson Valley native. The club was founded to promote the growth of talent in the region. They kicked off their first USL League Two season in 2022, the same season Vermont Green FC debuted.

The Hammers compete in the competitive Metropolitan Division, and while the likes of Long Island Rough Riders, FC Motown, and Manhattan SC have been the mainstays of dominance in the Metro, Hudson Valley have never been far behind. In their first four seasons, the club has three third place finishes, and one second place finish.

In 2025, the Hammers finished with 7 wins, 2 losses, and 3 draws in their 12 matches played. They finished only behind the undefeated Metropolitan Champions FC Motown, and 2022 national finalist Long Island Rough Riders.

The New Yorkers will be coming to Vermont with experience and a strong sense of regional pride, as many of the players hail from the Hudson Valley. In addition to their passion, they'll be coming in hot: the Hammers dismantled Ocean City Nor'easters 3-1 away from home on Tuesday. The Vermonters will need to be focused. Their opponents come in with a fog of unfamiliarity and a nothing-to-lose mindset.

The Green will look to their style, their turf, and their mighty fanbase to prove themselves superior. It's bound to be a hotly-contested affair in Burlington.

# HISTORY OF OUR CLUB

Vermont Green Football Club made its debut in USL League Two in 2022 and has quickly become one of the most talked-about teams in the American soccer landscape. Based in Burlington, Vermont, the team plays its home matches at Virtue Field on the University of Vermont campus, where capacity crowds regularly create one of the most exciting and inclusive atmospheres in the league. With season tickets consistently selling out and matchday attendance surging, Vermont Green has built a vibrant soccer culture that's taken root far beyond the pitch.

From the start, Vermont Green set out to be different. The club was founded with a mission rooted in environmental justice, with the bold aim of becoming a net-zero soccer organization. As a proud member of One Percent for the Planet, the club donates 1% of its annual revenue to vetted environmental causes. It also integrates sustainability into its operations, from team kits made from 100% recycled materials to ongoing efforts to reduce the club's environmental impact. This unique values-driven model has garnered widespread attention, earning coverage in *The Guardian*, *BBC Sport*, *The New York Times*, and the *Men in Blazers* podcast, among others.

Vermont Green made an immediate impression in its inaugural 2022 season. The club's first-ever match, a 4-0 win over Boston City FC, set the tone, and their first home game—attended by 1,001 fans—marked the beginning of something special in Burlington. Later that summer, the team clinched its first playoff berth in front of a sold-out crowd of 2,500 and advanced to the conference semifinals in its first year of existence.

Momentum continued in 2023. The club sold out all available season tickets, 1,250 in total, and five of seven home league matches were full houses. While Vermont Green narrowly missed the playoffs that season, they remained a competitive force on the field and a standout off of it. The club was named USL League Two's 2023 Organization of the Year, recognized from among 122 teams across the U.S. and Canada for its excellence on and off the pitch.

That same year, Vermont Green qualified for the U.S. Open Cup for the first time in club history. They defeated USL League One's Lexington SC 4-3 in a thrilling opening-round match before falling to MLS Next Pro side Carolina Core FC in front of another sold-out home crowd.

In 2024, the club launched a new tradition: the Maple Cup, an annual matchup between Vermont Green and the reigning champion of Canada's Ligue1 Québec. In June, the club also hosted its first-ever women's exhibition match against FC Laval, coached by former U.S. Women's National Team star Samewis. The match ended in a thrilling penalty shootout win after a 1-1 draw and was part of the club's broader commitment to uplifting women's sports and gauging regional demand for a permanent women's side. In 2025, the club built on this initiative by hosting two additional women's exhibition matches, both of which sold out, further demonstrating the appetite for high-level women's soccer in Vermont.

The 2025 season has marked a historic high point. Vermont Green went undefeated in the regular season and clinched the Northeast Division title in dramatic fashion, scoring twice in stoppage time to beat longtime rival Western Mass Pioneers on the road. It was a signature moment for a club that has continued to raise the bar for what's possible in USL League Two—on the field, in the community, and across the soccer world.

Off the field, Vermont Green remains deeply committed to the local community. The club actively partners with Vermont-based businesses, nonprofits, and sponsors to strengthen the state's local economy and create long-lasting, values-aligned relationships. From youth soccer programming and volunteer coaching to matchday sustainability activations and consistent outreach, Vermont Green continues to prove that a soccer club can be a platform for connection, impact, and purpose.

Four seasons in, Vermont Green Football Club is more than just a team. It's a movement built by the community, sustained by its values, and driven by the belief that sport, sustainability, and justice can work hand in hand to create lasting change.

# THE GREEN MOUNTAIN BHOYS



Formed during Vermont Green FC's inaugural season in 2022, the Green Mountain Bhoys are the club's supporters group. Their name nods to both Vermont's proud heritage and another legendary green team, the Boston Celtics. Since day one, they've brought energy, color, and a deep sense of community to every matchday.

## KING STREET CENTER

Vermont Green will donate free tickets through its "Spread the Love" initiative so they can attend home games throughout the season.

## JUBA STAR FC

Vermont Green is partnered with Juba Star Football Club to expand access to soccer and work towards equitable play in the state. Juba Star FC is a Somali Bantu-led organization that has operated in the state since 2006.
